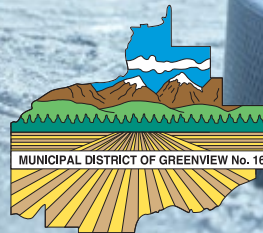

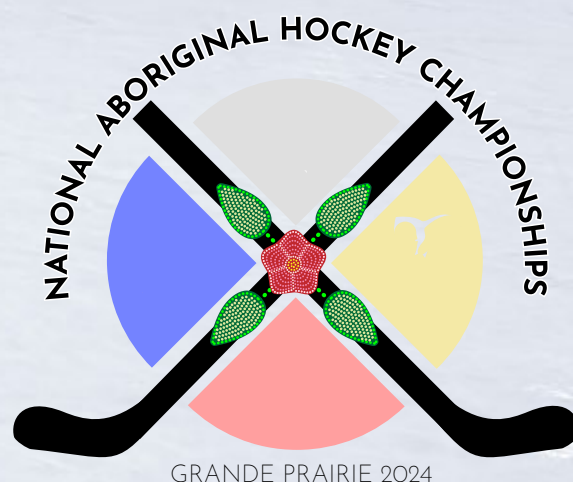

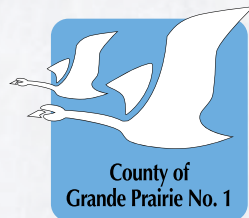

With the Hockey sticks tying it all together, this logo represents the different backgrounds and elements of Alberta and how we are all connected.

WALTER WHITE



Walter White, ᑭᑭᑦᑭᑦ, is Plains Cree from Treaty 6 Enoch Cree Nation. Having gone through childhood traumas which led to an extreme addictions lifestyle from his early teen years, he was fortunate to have found healing in both western and traditional practices. Struggling to find more connection to culture in an urban setting, Walter had to travel a lot to participate and learn about many different ceremonies. He then set out to have more Rounddance ceremonies and then started a Powwow in Grande Prairie so others may have access to the beautiful way of life he had experienced amongst these events.

Having discovered a passion for the culture and ceremonial lifestyle, he learned the real connection was to be found on the land. The gifts that Mother Earth made available for us resonated so much with Walter that he began creating unique items and became an artist who uses mostly land-based materials. Walter has become quite well known across Turtle Island for drum and rattle making, travelling and teaching these stories and practices in many communities. A few of his larger creations were commissioned and are featured in the Grande Prairie Regional Hospital and West Edmonton Mall.

EARL WOOD



Earl Wood hails from Saddle Lake, Alberta, and is one of the original founders of the Northern Cree Singers. Referred to by some as the "Indigenous Rolling Stones," the Northern Cree Singers are a Juno Award-winning group and have been nominated for six Grammy Awards.

Earl is fluently bilingual in English and Plains Cree.
